Conference Fellows help extend the benefits of MAFA workshops to non-attendees through lectures, demonstrations, or outreach activities back home. ## **Circular Sock Knitting Machine Mini-workshops**

Our Thursday afternoon classes are full, but we have one more space open on Friday evening 6:30 - 8:30 p.m., and several still open for day-trippers visiting the Marketplace on Saturday afternoon 2:00 - 4:00 p.m.

Milissa Ellison Dewey of Bobbin Boy, will offer Sock Machine Drivers' Ed for absolute beginners. Participants will make a knitted sampler and learn about the origins and history of the circular sock knitting machines. Each person will graduate with a Sock Machine Learner's Permit, take home a cast-on basket, a latching-up tool useful for all knitting, and a hand-turned toe jack (like a darning



egg on steroids), as well as handouts on supplies and suppliers, and a bibliography of reference and teaching resources. No equipment is required. Find details here: mafafiber.org/sock-knitting-machine-mini-workshops/.

## **WGGB Receives 2019 MAFA Grant**

MAFA has awarded a grant of \$1,530 to Weavers Guild of Greater Baltimore for public events and outreach in connection with their upcoming 70th Anniversary Show at the Baltimore County Arts Guild, July 5 through August 31, 2019. Activities will include an opening reception with weaving and spinning demonstrations, free family art-making classes (one focused on weaving, and another on spinning) and scholarships for beginning weaving classes for graduates or current students (age 18 to 25) of Baltimore City and County public schools.

What impressed us: The guild has a pool of experienced outreach instructors. The scholarship program is an outgrowth of WGGB's ongoing participation in Maker events at Baltimore Public Schools.

MAFA awards grants to member guilds and fiber-related non-profits for projects that support MAFA's mission. Grant awards typically range from \$500 to \$1,500 and several awards may be made each year. MAFA will accept applications for 2020 MAFA Grant awards beginning September 2019.
