Join the Textile Society of America at the Fabric Workshop and Museum (FWM) in Philadelphia for a panel discussion with Regan de Loggans, Karen Hampton and Lynnette Miranda devoted to envisioning a field that approaches cultural production with justice and equity, and to examine the ways that structures within museums, universities, and informal spaces can support or hinder movement towards a vibrant future in line with these goals. This program is intended for TSA members and curious prospective members who are embedded in institutions and systems as makers, researchers, professors and curators. We invite you bring experiences within your own institutions to the discussion, and hope that you will find new knowledge and connections to take back to your own practice.
